Skit, St. Thomas More

(Narrator, King Henry, and St. Thomas enter.)

Narrator: Thomas More was born in London in 1478. He was very smart, and he studied law at Oxford University. He worked as a lawyer, and then was elected to Parliament.

King Henry: Hi Thomas, it's good to see you. I've read your book Utopia, and I hear that you're very well respected among the bishops and and scholars.

(King Henry exits.)

Thomas: I'm so sorry to hear that! Is there any way your marriage can be saved?

King Henry: No way! I'm definitely getting divorced. The problem is that the pope says I can't do this.

Thomas: But King Henry, that's not just what the pope says. That's what Jesus says.
